Dear Parents and Carers

It has been another busy and successful week at school, with many opportunities for students to engage, reflect and contribute to our wider community.

Firstly, I would like to extend my thanks to the students and staff who supported our fantastic Open Evening on Thursday. The event was a tremendous success and provided a wonderful opportunity to showcase our school, our values and the achievements of #teamOxted. Visitors commented on the enthusiasm and pride demonstrated by our students and staff throughout the evening. Thank you to everyone who contributed to making the event such a positive experience.

Today we held our first whole-school Academic Review Day of the year. These important meetings provide students, parents and staff with an opportunity to reflect on progress so far, discuss targets and identify the support needed to ensure every student achieves their full potential. We are grateful to families for their engagement and partnership in supporting student success.

As students begin to consider their future pathways, we are also looking forward to welcoming prospective students and their families to our **Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday 8 October at 6pm**. ## Attendance

The vast majority of students have made an excellent start this year and we are delighted that most students' attendance is looking very positive. We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of the importance of attendance at school and remind you to please telephone the school to alert us to your child's absence for every day that they are off. Any days which are not accounted for by you (via telephone or email) will be counted as unauthorised absence.

As per Surrey County Council guidance, we will also issue fixed penalty notices (which can lead to fixed penalty fines) for extended periods of unauthorised absence.

### Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice

The Amount Payable Under a Penalty Notice: The Education (Penalty Notices) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2024.

1. If a parent/carers has not incurred a penalty notice relating to the relevant child/children since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carers per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3-year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carers per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3-year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carers per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996

- 90% Attendance - 20 days of absence - 100 hours of learning (potentially 120 hours in Year 11)
- 85% Attendance - 29 days of absence - 145 hours of learning (potentially 174 hours in Year 11)
- 80% Attendance adds up to missing two full years of education over their school life

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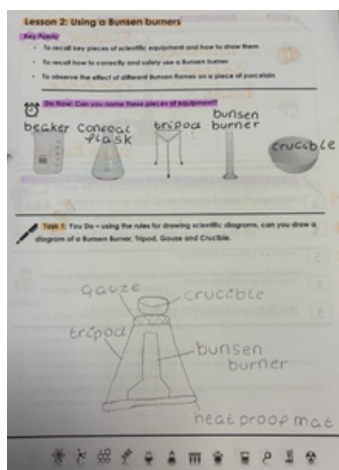
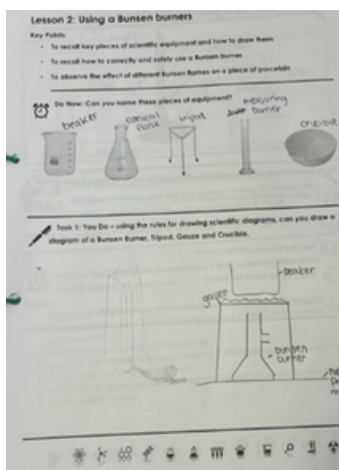

## Tutor Time

Tutors have been working hard with students on developing their Personal Development skills and exploring what makes a good student. Students have been encouraged to consider how the skills they develop at school can support them in their future careers and beyond.

A key focus has been understanding the strong connection between the skills students develop now (such as communication, teamwork, resilience, organisation, responsibility and problem-solving) and how valuable these skills will be in the workplace and in adult life.

Tutors have also used a range of case studies to help students identify different skills in real-life situations. This has encouraged students to recognise their own strengths, consider areas for development, and understand how the skills they are building today can contribute to their future success.

## Assemblies

This week's assembly focused on Diversity, encouraging students to recognise that although people may come from different backgrounds and belong to different groups, we can also share many similarities and common experiences.

Students watched a short clip exploring these ideas and considering what it means to be part of a diverse community. This will provide a starting point for further discussions within tutor groups, where students can explore how we can celebrate our differences while ensuring everyone feels included, valued and part of the wider school community.

With Black History Month approaching, tutors will also have the opportunity to create activities that celebrate and highlight different cultures, histories and experiences. The Sixth Form students are settling in well and making the most of all the opportunities available to them.

## Tutor time and Assemblies

Year 12 have been continuing to find out more about the skills and behaviours expected of them as part of the Sixth Form in tutor time and assemblies. As the term progresses they will be moving on to improving note taking and also revision strategies.

Year 13 have been focusing on reminders about the deadlines for their UCAS applications and getting started with their Personal statements.

## ID cards

Year 12 have received their chipped Sixth Form ID cards. We ask that they wear the cards and lanyards at all times when walking around the school. The ID cards are to be used to open the gates at the side of the school to enter and leave the premises. The security system records the times that they enter and leave site in case of a fire evacuation.

If the student comes on site or leaves using the back gates or when the site is open then we ask that students tap their card on the card readers in the common room or the group study room so that we know who is on site.

## Importance of High Attendance

In Sixth Form, students are expected to attend all lessons unless they are genuinely unwell and unable to participate in learning. Minor illnesses or discomforts that can be managed during the school day, and would not normally prevent attendance at work or other commitments, are not considered sufficient reasons for absence.

Developing excellent attendance habits is an important part of preparing for university, apprenticeships and future employment. Regular attendance supports academic progress, wellbeing and success.

We expect **all** Sixth Form students to maintain a minimum attendance rate of 96%.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day, they should report to Student Services for support. If it is necessary for them to leave site, they must sign out in accordance with school procedures.

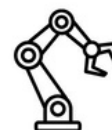
